REPORTS & ADMINISTRATION

Mr. Sahol thanked the Township Committee for introducing Ordinance 2022-16 establishing medical training for all of the police officers. The new policy will offer an alternative to EMT. Mayor Panfili stated that he spoke with the officers and they felt this training is just as good as the EMT training and more readily available. Once implemented, all of the police officers will be medically trained said Mr. Sahol.

Mr. Sahol reported that the Township is hosting a flu clinic on September 23rd and a COVID Booster Clinic on September 27th. All information on the clinics is posted on the Township Website.

Mr. Sahol stated that maintenance is needed on the Township parking lot. He asked the Township Committee about expanding the parking lot by about 30 spaces and re-striping the configuration for a better flow. Mayor Panfili agreed and asked for Mr. Sahol to report back at the next meeting with more details and cost of the project.

Mr. Liedtka stated the dead ash trees are becoming a safety concern in OYV and especially on White Pine Road where the trees are larger. He would like the Township to remove them. Mr. Liedtka asked Troy Ulshafer to mark the dead trees with paint for now and then they can be cut down throughout the winter. Troy suggested that the homeowners be notified. Mayor Panfili asked Troy to give an inventory of all the trees that need to come down for the next meeting.

Ms. Koetas-Dale asked if the Auditor will be rescheduling another visit since they could not make the last meeting. Mayor Panfili said that he spoke with the Auditor on the phone and he answered his questions about the audit. Mr. Sahol stated that based on the passing of the Resolution tonight the Audit will be sent to the State and posted on the Township website.

Ms. Blazic made a motion seconded by Ms. Koetas-Dale to open the meeting to public comment. All were in favor.

Mayor Panfili stated that public comment will be limited to three minutes per person and everyone will have an opportunity to speak.

Hearing no comments, Mr. Liedtka made a motion seconded by Ms. Blazic to close public comment. All were in favor.

Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Ms. Blazic to go into Executive Session at 6:55 pm for matter related to attorney client privilege. All were in favor.

Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Ms. Blazic to go back into regular session at 7:09 pm. All were in favor.

Ms. Koetas-Dale made a motion seconded by Mr. Liedtka to adjourn the meeting. All were in favor. Meeting adjourned at 7:10 PM.
